On Monday morning in the viticulture workshop "Bud Break to Leaf Fall" we will cover information on site evaluation, cultivar selection, vineyard fertility, weed, disease and insect management which will culminate with managing fruit quality. The viticulture and enology programs will be running concurrently so we can offer you more information over the 2 day conference. This poses some problems with those of you who want to attend both viticulture and enology sessions but our intention is to offer as much value and information for your bucks as we possibly can. This is a golden opportunity to ask questions and discuss what other growers and Dr. Dami are recommending. One of the Value Added benefits we are offering this year is 3.5 hours of pesticide recertification credits and also an hour or core credits.
