<u>Vineyard Custom Rates</u>- David Marrison, OSU Extension Educator will provide a summary of the 2015 Ohio Vineyard Custom Rates Survey.

Managing Crown Gall in Grapes- The winter damage of 2014 means that crown gall will rear its ugly head in Ohio Vineyards in 2015 and beyond. Nationally recognized expert in crown gall of grape, Dr. Tom Burr, Professor of Plant Pathology at Cornell University will be on hand to provide an update on this disease.

<u>An Update on Grape Disease Control</u>– Dr. Mike Ellis, OSU Professor Emeritus, will update producers on grape disease control. Learn the latest in chemical and sustainable disease control options. Producers are encouraged to bring their disease management questions.

<u>Weed Control</u>- Dr. Doug Doohan will join us to discuss managing weeds in vineyards. Learn what is new in weed control and learn strategies for controlling weeds where lots of renewal shoots are present.

<u>Lunch</u> – Join us as we fellowship together with a "create your own" baked potato with a variety of toppings including cheese, sour cream, chopped bacon and green onions. 
<u>Using Rootstocks to Your Advantage</u>- Dr. Peter Cousins, grape breeder at E. & J. Gallo Winery, will help producers learn more about rootstocks. Learn more about the grapevine improvement program he leads which focuses on the breeding, introduction, and evaluation of proprietary wine grape varieties and selections with enhanced quality. Before joining E. & J. Gallo Winery, Peter was grape rootstock breeder and geneticist with USDA ARS, based at Geneva, New York, for more than 12 years and in that role he bred and introduced five grape varieties, including rootstocks and genetics research varieties.

<u>Lessons Learned from the 2014 Polar Vortex</u> – Dr. Imed Dami will be presenting an update on the trials of managing grapevines after winter injury as well as a summary of lessons learned from the 2014 polar vortex.

<u>Lessons Learned on Soil Sampling</u> – Eric Cotton, grape grower in Lake County, will share a comparison of soil test results run by three different testing laboratories. Learn how to read soil tests from different companies.

<u>Are you Measuring Up with your Pesticide Sprays and Adjuvents?</u> – Les Ober, OSU Extension Program Assistant and Certified Crop Consultant, will help producers learn how to be more accurate when it comes to measuring pesticides and will share more on spray adjuvents. Learn what they are and what do they do. An update on the new 2,4D and Dicamba herbicides will also be discussed.
